## **Course Outline**

"Philosophical texts in English", History of Philosophy Master's Program, Fall 2017 William James, "Consciousness of Self"

## Course description

This course will consist in the reading, translation and commentary of the chapter on "Consciousness of Self' in William James' *Principles of Psychology*. This is an important and influential text both for Husserl's phenomenology and 20<sup>th</sup> century philosophy of mind. It explores the difficulties and tries the clear up the ambiguities involved in being conscious of ourselves and understanding our relationship to our own consciousness. At each session, we will translate a passage from that week's reading discuss points of translation and interpretation. We will consider both the place of the text in the philosophical tradition and its theses and arguments for themselves.
